

# More attractions in the Eagle Valley

So you're having a nice relaxing vacation on the beach and you feel the urge to do something different, maybe a little crazy like flying through trees. There are options...



The Sky Trek Adventure Park is the ultimate zip line experience in the beautiful Monashee Mountains. Fight your way over suspension bridges and swinging logs or slide from tree to tree on a skateboard. There are adult and kids courses.

They're open everyday from mid May to mid October. In the summer months hours are 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. You'll find them midway between Sicamous and Revelstoke on the Trans Canada Highway right next to the Enchanted Forest. 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It doesn't matter how many times you go to the Enchanted Forest; it's still enchanting. For the young and old, the images of fairyland scattered about in a beautiful old growth forest is always magical. Visit Jack in the Beanstock, Humpty Dumpty, Snow White and the Seven Dwarves. Go inside the castle dungeon, or walk along the boardwalk or take a ride in a rowboat. Discover the magic, take a walk in the Enchanted Forest. They're located 35 kilometres east of Sicamous right on the Trans Canada. Phone 1-866-944-9744.

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Beardale Miniatureland is a world in motion on a very small scale. There are model railways and towns and colourful fantasy land characters who come alive with a touch of a button. You can also take a stroll down their nature trails. For more information call 1-888-667-2109. This is the number to Three Valley Gap Chateau, which manages this tourist treasure.

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Three Valley Gap Chateau is one of the most stunning sights in the entire province. With the mountain backdrop and lake in the foreground the chateau, with its bright red roof has a comforting and welcoming feel. This 200-room resort comes with outdoor gardens, a sandy beach, a children's play area, indoor swimming, and a family dining room.

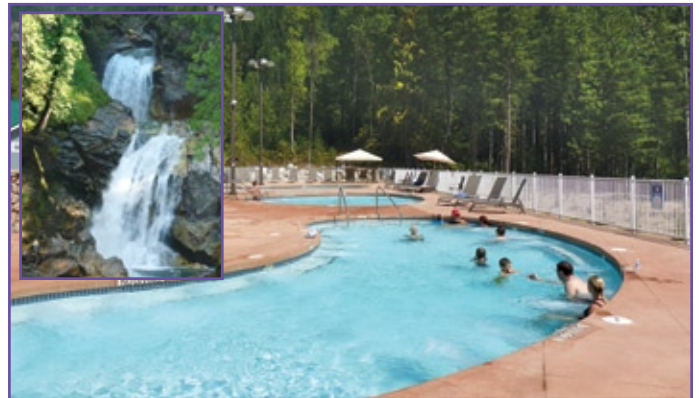


Right next to the chateau is the Three Valley Gap Heritage Ghost Town complete with displays of the pioneer days in the 1800s. Call them at 1-888-667-2109. The heritage ghost town is located right on the Trans Canada about 19 kilometres west of Revelstoke.

## Stop at Crazy Creek

Crazy Creek is a destination spot people just fall in love with. It's hard to describe the ambience; it's one of those 'you had to be there' kind of places.

Waterfalls cascade down its path amidst the dense forest. You can enjoy the splendour of it as you hike up the wooded boardwalks, stairs and platforms. Or if you're not up for the hike, you can relax in the hot pools. Now you might think hot pools are hot pools wherever you go, but these ones are amazingly lovely.



The three pools offer a total of 2,000 square feet of pristine glacial blue colour. Don't let 'glacial' scare you off. The water, which comes from a well at the source of Eagle Pass Mountain, is heated geo-thermally and does not contain sulphur.

You come out soothed, refreshed, calmed and reinvigorated. While you're sitting in the hot pools, you're breathing in the mountain air and gazing at majestic scenery.

The really fun part is the suspension bridge. The bridge, which has a span of 73 metres, is right in front of the falls.

You hear the roar and feel the mist.

There are amenities available including an ice cream parlour and souvenir and gift shop. If you bring your own lunch, there are picnic tables on the patio.

There is a fee to go on the suspension bridge and boardwalk but admission is free on Sundays, in honour of the Lord's Day.

Accommodations are available: you can park your RV (any size) or stay at one of the suites.
